Publications Director Matt Wascavage reported on progress with our consultant who is helping us make a decision on post-2024 publishing. He also reported that three of our journals—*Crop, Forage and Turfgrass Management, Journal of Environmental Quality,* and *The Plant Genome*—are taking part in a pilot program to encourage authors to submit plain language summaries.

- 1. 2023 CSSA Presidential Award: Natalia De Leon, University of Wisconsin who made maize genomes to fields possible.
- 2. Latest Registrations for ASA-CSSA-SSSA Annual Meeting Oct. 29-Nov. 1 in St. Louis www.acsmeetings.org:
 - 1,289 current registrants compared to 2022 Baltimore's 916/2019 San Antonio's 1,232 at same time
 - 1,258 in-person registrations
 - o 31 virtual registrations
 - 141% to 2022 / 105% to 2019 total registrations at this time of the year
 - We are currently 102% to San Antonio's in-person registrations at this time of the year
 - 2019 San Antonio had 3,945 total in-person registrations
 - Projections at this point are encouraging given the record number of submissions this year. Approximately 4,400 are expected for St. Louis in-person attendance
 - By comparison, there were 3,555 onsite attendees for Baltimore (3,695 total registrants)
 - Our historical trends show that most registrations (whether virtual or in-person) come in during the final three weeks leading up to the event
